

Ridge Avenue is the neighborhood commercial corridor for the Roxborough community. The Roxborough Development Corporation (RDC) board, volunteers, and staff have been working hard since 1992 to enhance Ridge Avenue by promoting special events, beautifying and cleaning, helping existing businesses to expand while recruiting new ones, and marketing the corridor throughout the year.

The Roxborough Business Improvement District (Roxborough BID) is one of sixteen business improvement districts in the City of Philadelphia. Since 2003, the RDC has collected a yearly assessment from property owners in the Roxborough BID to pay for and leverage additional services that benefit every BID member.



RDC Mission & Program Information

The mission of the Roxborough Development Corporation (RDC) is to provide Roxborough residents with high quality shopping, dining, and entertainment experiences.

The RDC focuses on the following **four program areas** to advance the Ridge Avenue commercial corridor as the heart and hub of the Roxborough community:

ASSET ENHANCEMENT: Encouraging a diverse business mix on Ridge Avenue by helping existing businesses expand and recruiting new businesses.

DISTRICT IMPROVEMENTS: Keeping the district clean, attractive, and safe to add to neighborhood quality of life.

MARKETING: Communicating good news about the Ridge Avenue commercial district through traditional and social media channels.

SPECIAL EVENTS: Maintaining a yearlong calendar of fun retail and special events to drive customers into shops and restaurants.

Asset Enhancement Highlights

NEW BUSINESSES IN THE BID

9 new businesses opened or prepared to open in the Roxborough BID during FY 2023. Newly opened businesses included Kids at Play, Lil' Filmmakers, Rally House, Lucky's Roadside Stand, Sunshine Sandwich Shop, The Biscuit Lady, The Natural Xpression, and Unity Java.



BID Reauthorization

In 2023 the Roxborough Development Corporation went through the process of reauthorization of the Business Improvement District. This reauthorization will enable the RDC to continue its important work revitalizing Ridge Avenue, providing property owners and businesses with commercial corridor services, and offering Roxborough residents more local shopping, dining, and entertainment options.

TAX CREDIT PROGRAM FUNDING


State and local tax credit programs provide an incentive for corporations to support BIDs and CDCs by offering a break on business-related taxes. In FY 2023 the RDC entered Year2, in its CDC Tax Credit Partnership with the City's of Philadelphia, which provides \$100,000 in operating funds annually over 10 years. Penn Beer committed \$85,000 and Ridge Holdings LLC committed \$15,000 through this partnership.

PA DCED Community Economic Assistance Program Grant Award

The RDC received a \$75,000 grant from the PA Department of Community and Economic Development. This grant will enable us to prune overgrown street trees, prepare locations for new trees, repair dangerous sidewalks, seal and restripe our parking lots, repair parking lot lighting, and refresh the Dupont Street parking lot entrance.

Public Landscapes

The RDC continued to brighten the Ridge Avenue commercial corridor with dragonfly begonias for the summer and fresh-cut greens, red ribbons, and wreaths for the holidays. Our public landscape services also kept Ridge Avenue's curbs and sidewalks weed-free, mulched 100 street trees, and maintained the Roxborough Pocket Park.

BID BEAUTIFICATION & CLEANING PROGRAM

RDC maintains a 2.5-mile neighborhood commercial corridor with five miles of curb and sidewalk, an active pocket park, and two public parking lots. It also provides information and aid to the over 250 businesses and hundreds of weekly visitors in the BID. Cleaning, hospitality, and public safety are critical to cultivating a positive perception of Ridge Avenue among businesses, residents, and shoppers.

The RDC maintains sidewalk planters, street trees, public landscapes and decorates Ridge Avenue for the holidays. Shade, flowers, and inviting green spaces are critical to a walkable commercial corridor that connects the community to shopping, dining, and parks and trails.





Pop Up Markets

• RDC held it's first 3-Day Pop Up Market for Happy Holidays in an unused retail space and within the Pocket Park. Over 30 vendors and 2,500 people attended.


